HEALTH & COMMUNITY NOTICES

🔁 Health Benefits Transfer Period Open Through Nov 30

Active and retired members can change health plans, add or drop dependents, or modify the Optional Rider during this window.

Changes take effect January 1, 2026.

Cost-of-Living Adjustments (COLA) for 2026

- FDNY Pension COLA: 1.2% increase = +\$18/month
- Social Security COLA: 2.8% increase = +\$56/month average
- These increases apply automatically. No action needed.

Reinstatement Offer to Unvaxxed City Workers

The City is offering a second chance at reinstatement for roughly 3,000 municipal employees fired under the 2021-2022 vaccine mandate.

Those who reapply:

- Will return at current pay rates
- Will not receive back pay
- Are not required to waive their right to sue

Why that last part matters:

In the previous reinstatement window (2023), returning workers were forced to sign a waiver agreeing not to pursue legal action.

This time around, you can come back and still retain your right to sue the City for lost wages, benefits, or civil service rights.

It's a major shift—and one worth understanding if you or someone you know was affected.

A Retirees Sue City Over Health Plan Changes

A coalition of NYC retirees and active workers has filed suit to stop the City's push to replace traditional health plans—like GHI Senior Care—with a self-funded insurance model.

Their concerns:

- Fewer legal protections when coverage is denied
- Reduced options for dNovors and hospitals
- Increased out-of-pocket costs
- Loss of benefits retirees were promised when they left the job

City Hall says the change will save money. Retirees say it breaks the contract they earned through decades of service.

This case could affect all current and future City retirees—whether they realize it yet or not.

The legal fight is ongoing, but the message is clear: Don't look away.

🙆 Ground Zero Toxin Investigation Ordered

For the first time, NYC's Department of Investigation is digging into what city agencies knew about 9/11 toxins—and when.

The probe was ordered by the City Council after years of pressure from first responders and survivors dealing with long-term illness.

The stakes:

- Over 140,000 people are enrolled in the WTC Health Program
- More than 81,000 already suffer from certified exposure-related conditions
- New evidence may show that warnings were delayed or information was withheld If that proves true, it could lead to expanded benefits, new lawsuits, and longoverdue accountability for thousands of responders still dealing with the consequences of their sacrifice.

This investigation is just beginning—but its impact could echo for years.



IN MEMORY OF FIREFIGHTER PATRICK BRADY LADDER 120 - 11 YEARS OF SERVICE



On November 8, 2025, Firefighter Patrick Brady, age 42, made the ultimate sacrifice while operating at a 5-alarm fire at 9407 Kings Highway in Brooklyn. While working on the roof, he went into cardiac arrest and was later pronounced dead at Brookdale University Hospital.

He was appointed to the FDNY on July 14, 2014. After graduating from the Academy, he was assigned to Engine 227 in Brooklyn, and later transferred to Ladder 120 in 2022. His reputation: dependable, committed, sharp. The kind of firefighter you wanted on your rig. Patrick is the 1,163rd member of the FDNY to die in the line of duty. He is remembered by his brothers and sisters in the firehouse, by his family, and by all of us who understand what it means to go toward the danger when others are running away.

"We will never forget."


